

Culinary Stars of Tomorrow Compete in The Education Fund's Student Top Chef Competition

Taste of Education features a culinary panel of local celebrity chefs.

MIAMI (March 2, 2022) – The Education Fund (<u>EducationFund.org</u>) celebrates the culinary dreams and ambitions of public school students at the **2022 Taste of Education** on Tuesday, March 15, from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. at historic Hialeah Park, 100 E 32nd St., in Hialeah.

Taste of Education (**#tasteofeducation**) showcases the talents of students from 17 culinary programs in Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Students from middle and high school will prepare and plate gourmet bites and vie for \$20,000 in top prizes. Guests get a chance to weigh in, voting for their top choice at the gala and fundraiser.

The judges – top local chefs and food writers – will determine the winning teams. This year's culinary panel features renowned local chefs Ralph Pagano, Allen Susser, Letty Alvarez, Dayanny De La Cruz, Ingrid Hoffmann, Max Santiago, and Linda Gassenheimer. Each team will present their dish and make their pitch, hoping to wow the judges with their skill and presentation.

Guests will feast on the students' creations and enjoy mini installations showcasing The Education Fund's programs, including walking through a food forest. On the menu is an array of dishes slated to delight the palate: Caribbean Veggie Stew, Bang Bang Salmon Tacos, *Torrejas Cubanas*, Cheddar Bay Biscuit Snapper Sliders, Cauliflower Burgers With Goat Cheese and Date Jam, Thai Sweet Soy Chicken, Corvina Ceviche, Key Lime Shooters, and so much more.

"A Taste of Education gives public school students a chance to compete before culinary giants in South Florida's restaurant industry," said Linda Lecht, president of The Education Fund. "Our culinary competition serves as a learning experience that can help our budding chefs prepare for a career in hospitality."

A Taste of Education also celebrates the more than 100 volunteers in the 2021-22 Teach-A-Thon, a campaign that fosters awareness of the teaching profession and teaching quality, while raising money for educators and their students. This year's Teacher Champions featured Wells Fargo employees, CEOs, community leaders, and business professionals who "stepped into the shoes" of local educators.
